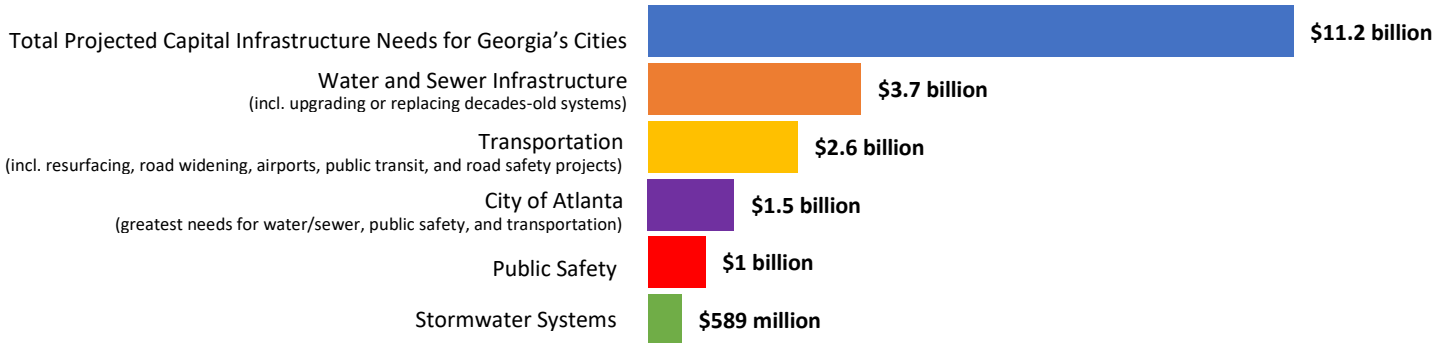

 Transit: **D-**

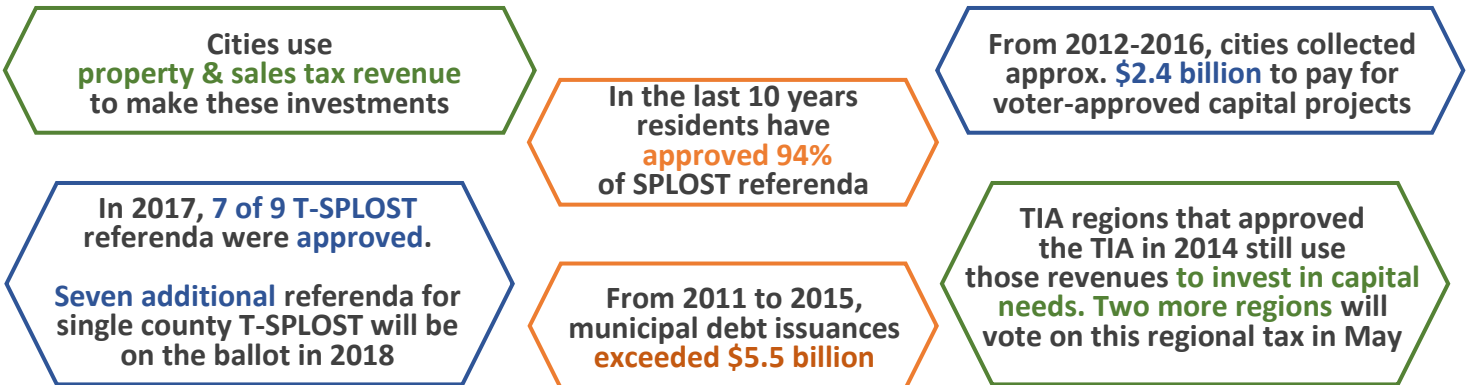
American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) 2014 Report Card

Delayed infrastructure investment will lead to **higher cost** to repair and replace aging systems

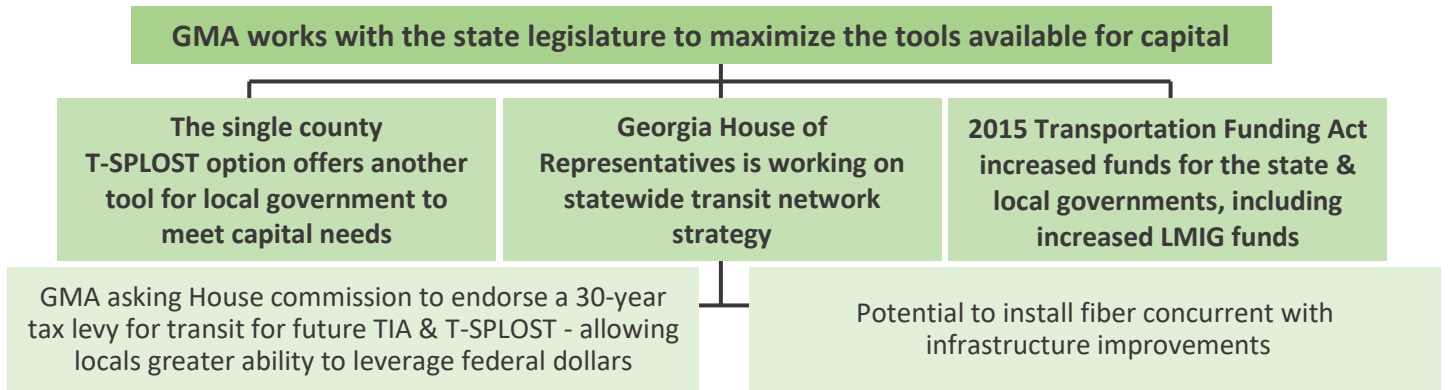
LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ARE INVESTING IN THEMSELVES:



CITIES ALSO WORK HARD ON INNOVATIVE PROJECTS...



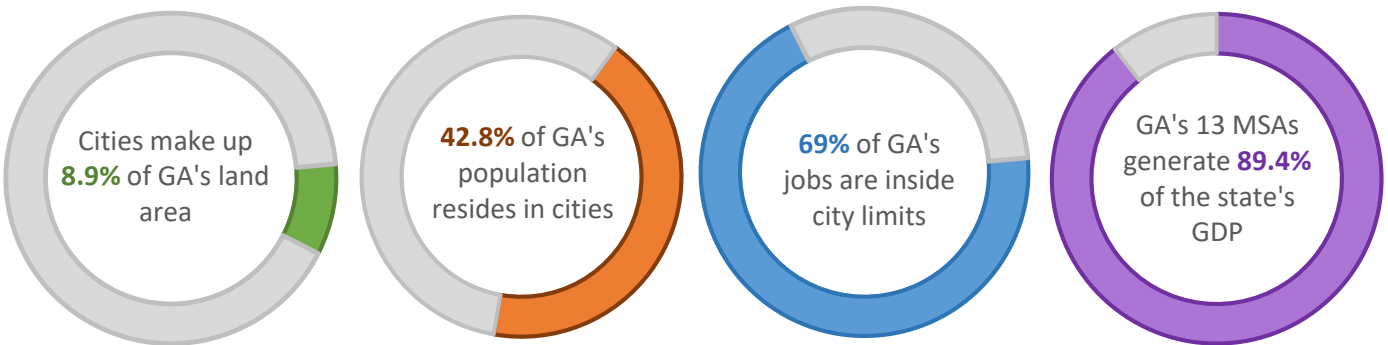
